LOWLINC Speaker Series: Legal Topics for Seniors. Wednesday, May 3, 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon. LOW Community Center.



Legal issues often seem so complicated or confusing that we neglect dealing with them. Questions arise: Who needs a will, a trust, powers of attorney, or advanced medical directives? Attorney Katherine Charapich's presentation will aid in understanding estate planning documents that can help provide protection for persons as well as their financial investments. Ms. Charapich will discuss protecting individuals' interests and well-being should they become incapacitated and protecting assets for their care. She will also address ways to ease the transfer of remaining assets to beneficiaries.

Katherine Charapich, a lawyer based in Culpeper, Virginia, focuses on estate planning, elder law matters, and business formation and contracts. Ms. Charapich obtained her Juris Doctor from Liberty University School of Law, where she also served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Liberty Legal Journal*.
